Role Purpose

- Develop a good knowledge of local geology, local history, Mary Anning and fossils and be able to answer questions and queries during visits.
- Help and assist teachers with the supervision of children in the museum and shop.
- Help the Education Officer maintain good health and safety practices during group visits.

USEFUL SKILLS/INTERESTS

There is no definite knowledge that is needed for this role, as training will be given, however good communication skills, a friendly and approachable manner is essential and the ability to keep calm under pressure is also helpful. An interest in or knowledge of fossils, local geology and the museum would be helpful.
